

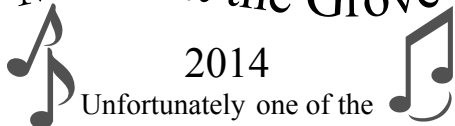

**6.00 Taizé Service
 led by Reverend Alistair Jones**

Worship in the Taizé style focuses on prayer and bible reading supported by simple songs. This simplicity allows contemplation and meditation, and encourages spirituality. Because the style of worship is different from other church services it may take time to become accustomed to a Taizé service. The songs are often repetitive, occasionally accompanied by a soloist, and there is no dominant leadership from musical instruments. Instead, alternative melodies may be used to enhance the beauty of human voices singing in harmony.
