#### Use of chemicals at the Grove

The word 'chemicals' can conjure up visions of dangerous substances like hydrochloric acid and the like. The Chemicals I refer to are the everyday things we use in our Church buildings, such as washing up liquid, disinfectants, toilet cleaners etc. Some of these can indeed be dangerous though, especially if swallowed. Some people can suffer skin re-actions to certain chemicals as indeed I do. Our building is open to our Church members and the public for a huge range of activities and age groups. This is a pure estimate, but we will have somewhere in the region of 250 children alone coming to our buildings each week. With this amount of users it is essential that we are stringent in our approach to health and safety. I believe we do very well on this matter at the Grove with annual fire risk assessments, health and safety, fire equipment, hygiene and environmental certificates, training, first aid etc. (to name a few) Could I therefore ask for your co-operation on a simple matter:

I occasionally find chemicals brought onto our premises i.e. washing up liquid, cleaners etc. that have not been sourced with our suppliers, who have a duty to provide product information sheets or COSHH (care of substances hazardous to health) Each product I get for the Grove has a data sheet providing information that helps a user to make a risk assessment. It describes its chemical make up and gives information on handling, storage and emergency measures in case of an accident. For those who don't know, this is stored in the main kitchen drawer by the heated cabinet.

If you have brought a substance into the building we do not have such a data sheet and this could place some extra liability on us if there was an incident and no or limited information can be found. So please don't. If something has run out then a simple message to Alan will see it replaced and we have ample stock of our products. If you have a request for a particular product or its equivalent then also ask Alan and if it's practicable to provide it, then it will be done.
